(S) [REDACTED], Chief Research Scientist at [REDACTED], was interviewed on November 11th, 2013, at a secure location at the FBI Field Office in [REDACTED], [REDACTED] provided the following information:

(S) In nearly 25 years of research, [REDACTED] said he had rarely seen the rates of unexplained activity he was witnessing in and around CenturyLink Field in Seattle, Washington. He and his colleagues referred to this locus of unexplained data points as AREA 29, and believed with "a high degree of confidence" that the activity was extraterrestrial in nature.

(S) [REDACTED] stated that research findings recollected both the POLAMALU AFFAIR of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and the REED INCIDENTS of Baltimore, Maryland, though neither case had been marked by events of the frequency or intensity of AREA 29.

(S) [REDACTED] noted that data had been corroborated through infrared radiation, radar, seismic activity, chance videos and photographs, as well as numerous eyewitness accounts.

(S) According to [REDACTED], activity in AREA 29 originated in September of 2011, ran through January 2012, and repeated during the same time span in each subsequent year. With every NFL season since 2011-12, said [REDACTED], activity had become more frequent and increasingly intense.

(S) In August of 2013, said [REDACTED], infrared cameras detected humanoid forms traversing AREA 29 at high rates of speed -- rates "inconsistent with the physical limitations of homo sapiens." Repeated film sessions tracked these same forms over the months that followed, [REDACTED] detailed. In

virtually all cases, activity was concentrated on Sundays, with a few exceptions for flex games and Monday Night Football.

(S) [REDACTED] said that in-game and post-game responses from opposing players -- especially on offense -- provided indirect signs that something "was happening on a consistent basis, and it was clearly out of the ordinary, perhaps extraordinary." Player facial expressions, he said, ranged from shock to disbelief to "outright shell shock and stupefaction." [REDACTED] had approached a number of players for interview requests, but all had declined. He was aware of several players who had undergone psychiatric counseling following games at CenturyLink.

(S) According to [REDACTED], the mental state of Seattle Seahawks fans at CenturyLink field was an additional indicator that "something was amiss" in AREA 29. Normal football fans, he said, do not exhibit world-record setting volumes of noise, or the degree of "rabid passion" displayed by Seattle's 12th Man, as its fans are known. [REDACTED] suggested that some sort of "subsonic" energy in AREA 29 was manipulating the 12th Man into a frenzied, altered state.

(S) Though it seemed unlikely due to the sheer number of reported incidents, [REDACTED] stated his belief that all unexplained events in AREA 29 had been caused by a single extraterrestrial source. He cited the similarity of heat signatures captured by infrared cameras during football games as evidence. Nearly all of these signatures, he said, "were a virtual match."

(S) Despite the preponderance of evidence, [REDACTED] refused to identify this extraterrestrial source, citing the need for certainty. When SSAs suggested it might be [REDACTED], given that he wore the number [REDACTED], [REDACTED] said, "You might be onto something."
